The 151st Warkworth Show 2023

As I write this, the environment around me is coming to life, hedges and trees are greening up, birds are nesting and everything is taking on that green hue.

We hear so much today about climate change and environment. The Warkworth Show must have been one of the first green associations in Warkworth. It encouraged the community to grow, show and share gardening tips. My first memories of Ember Gardens were of one big market garden with rows of immaculately tended vegetables and flowers, long carrots grown in fifty-gallon drums of sand and leeks grown in trenches of a very secret potion, but it was maybe best not to know. All the produce from Ember was taken home and turned into everyday meals, jams and preserves, to see families through the winter, no freezers in those days.

Last year's Show was a great success given the new team we had organising it and the lack of experience this brought with it. This year we will have the Food Court, lots of Children's activities in the Castle Courtyard, Vintage/Classic Cars, and Trade Stands, Craft Demonstrations, the Dog Show and Warkworth Drama Group will put on an historical enactment.

I look to forward to welcoming you to the 151st Warkworth Show.

AIMS AND RULES OF THE SHOW

- 1.1 The Society shall be known as The Warkworth Show, and shall consist of Patron, President, Chairman, Honorary Vice-Presidents, Honorary Secretary, and Honorary Treasurer. There will be an Events Management Committee and Exhibition Committee. Committee members shall be deemed to have resigned if they fail to attend over a period of two years.
- 1.2 The objects of the Society shall be the promotion and development of the skills which are identified by the classes published in the Show Schedule, by holding Shows, competitions, lectures and discussions.
- 1.3 Entry forms must be sent with fees or emailed to the Entries Secretary **NOT LATER THAN THE WEDNESDAY PRIOR to Show Day**. Emailed entries must be paid for on Show Day before exhibiting.
- 1.4 ONLY ONE ENTRY PER PERSON PER CLASS is allowed.
- 1.5 Any article previously entered in The Warkworth Show which has not won a prize may be re-entered for competition. No exhibit which has previously won a prize can be entered again.
- 1.6 Each Horticultural exhibitor shall, if required, on the day of the Show sign a declaration that the specimens he/she claims to exhibit for prizes have been in his/her possession for at least two months prior to the Show.
All work entered into the Exhibition classes must be entirely the work of the exhibitor.
- 1.7 All exhibitors must leave the marquee by 9:45am to allow judging to commence.
- 1.8 **Each exhibit must bear its class number and unique Exhibitor's Number.**
- 1.9 Where there are fewer than 3 entries in a class, prizes will be awarded at the judges' discretion.
- 1.10 The judges shall have the power to withhold a prize for any exhibit not worthy of a place. Vegetables should be fit for table use.
- 1.11 THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL.

- 1.12 Every care will be taken with exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- 1.13 To claim prize money, exhibitors must fill in the claim form and hand it in to the appropriate Prize Claim Payout Point on Show Day between 3:00pm and 4:00pm.
- 1.14 Exhibits must not under any circumstances be collected before **4:30pm**. Only holders of 'Lifting Tickets' may collect exhibits.
- 1.15 Any complaints and protests must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary on Show Day and must be accompanied by a deposit of £1. The deposit is to be returned if the protest be affirmed.
- 1.16 In Horticulture classes, exhibitors must provide their own stands, vases, bowls etc. (unless specified).
- 1.17 In craft classes all entries in knitting must be done by hand. Articles must not be washed or dry-cleaned. Soiled articles are liable to disqualification.
- 1.18 In cookery all cakes may be cut in judging.

General Data Protection Regulation

The Warkworth Show has a legal duty to protect any personal information we collect from members, entrants, friends, sponsors and advertisers.

- We will only use personal information you supply to us for the purpose for which you supplied it
- We will only hold your information for as long as it is necessary to fulfil that purpose
- We will not pass your information to any other parties unless you agreed to that when supplying the information
- All Show members who have access to personal information are obliged to respect your confidentiality
- Persons providing information may at any time ask for it to be removed from our records

FIRST TIME YOU'VE ENTERED THE SHOW?

An easy guide to help you!

- Browse through the schedule and decide which classes you would like to enter and fill in the appropriate entry form. Note most classes are open to anyone to enter, but do check for any limits like area or age.
- If you have any questions, or require any help relating to entering into the Horticultural or Industrial or Children's classes, please contact the Chairman or Secretary.
- Fill in the form and email it to entries@warkworthshow.co.uk. Emailed entries must be paid for on Show Day before exhibiting. Alternatively, post or drop your form in to the Entries Secretary's house (address on entry form) or Gray's in Warkworth by **the due date** and with the correct entry money. If you need more entry forms, please use a spare sheet of paper.
- As Show Day approaches, sort out your entries by putting a class number label on each one (children's entries also need a label stating their age and school year).
- On Show Day, please arrive early – from 7:00am – at the marquee and look for the Secretary. She/he will give you an envelope that will contain your unique Exhibitor's Number which enables your exhibit to be identified after judging is carried out. **Please remember that fees for entries submitted by email must be paid when you collect your envelope and before staging exhibits.**
- Attach your unique Exhibitor's Number to each exhibit. Then place your exhibit in the class areas marked out on the tables. There'll be lots of help around if you need it.
- **Exhibits must be staged by 9:45am.**
- In the envelope there will be a claim form to fill in later if you win a prize, and a Lifting Card that allows you to collect your exhibits at the end of the day. Keep these safely!
- Prize money can be collected by filling in the claim form and presenting it to the Payout Point in the Treasurer's tent between 3:00 and 4:00pm.

4 Bourbon biscuits
made to the following recipe

75g (3oz) plain flour
50g (2oz) butter or margarine
1 egg yolk
2 tsp water
15g (½ oz) cocoa powder
50g (2oz) caster sugar
¼ tsp vanilla

Icing
75g (3oz) chocolate
15g (½ oz) butter

Method

1. Sieve flour and cocoa together
2. Cream butter/margarine and sugar and beat in yolk and vanilla
3. Add flour, cocoa, water and mix to a stiff dough
4. Roll out thinly and cut into 24 rectangles (approx. 3 by 1 inches)
5. Put on greased baking sheets, prick each 4 times with a fork
6. Bake for 10 minutes at 180°C (gas mark 4)
7. When cool, sandwich together with the chocolate icing made by melting chocolate and butter in a heatproof bowl over a pan of hot water
Cool slightly before using
8. Sprinkle biscuits with sugar
